Building Independence

KNOW YOUR LIMITS!

The first few computing lessons in school for KS2 consolidate the prior learning on online safety and things that we need to do to keep ourselves safe online. If you aren't a games player yourself, it can be hard to decide what is a suitable game for your child to play. Since 2012, PEGI has been the sole system used in the UK for new console and PC games. These ratings can help you decide if the game is suitable for your child.

The internet is also full of many excellent websites that are of great use http://www.askaboutgames.com/ and https://videostandards.org.uk/RatingBoard/ have large databases of games and further information that are very easily searchable so parents can be informed, without having to play hundreds of games yourself!





The app TikTok currently has a PEGI rating of 13 which means that it should not be used by anyone under the age of 13—so no children in Primary School at all!

Unfortunately, we have had a few reports of pupils creating Tiktoks. We have spoken to pupils and parents about this but ask that all parents check their children's phones to make sure they haven't got this app.
