COVID Information for Parents

As a school we have followed National Guidance from the Department for Education and advice from Coventry County Council to make sure we reduce the risk to the school community.

We ask that any pupils showing symptoms of COVID-19 and their brothers and sisters stay at home and parents arrange for a test for the child to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19).

If the child tests positive they will need to start a 10-day isolation period from the day they develop symptoms.

Other members of their household (including any siblings) should self-isolate for 14 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms.

During this time the teachers will arrange work for pupils who have to isolate and the Learning Mentors will keep in contact with families so we can get pupils back into school as soon as it is safe to do so.
