Why is PE Kit important?

This question is asked by parents and pupils alike and perhaps this small space in the newsletter is a good opportunity to explain why it is needed.

Good PE kit (including shoes) allows pupils to move freely and safely around. Skirts and dresses could become caught on the high apparatus! Also pupils can become hot and sweaty when taking a full and active part in lessons, as adults we take part in sports in correct kit so it is a good habit to learn.

Why shouldn't my child just wear the football teams kit that they support?

This is a bit like asking:- Who plays football in Black and White Stripes? Why do cricket teams have different kits?

It is all to do with being part of one team, we wear a school uniform to give us a whole school identity and PE and school sport is part of this. Even more important that when it comes to sporting competitions like Indoor athletics , Agility or even Netball against other schools—we look like a team so we play as a team.
