It is now only 3 weeks to go until the end of term so it may seem an odd time to talk about reading in a Newsletter and even stranger to be holding Reading Workshops for parents in Year 2, 3 & 4 next week. However good reading and understanding is such an important skill and one that requires a partnership between home and school.

Reading is one of the easiest and simplest ways of helping your child in nearly all aspects of learning. It is such an important skill that we use across all aspects of the curriculum. Just a quarter of an hour each day hearing your child read and asking them questions about their book or newspaper will really help them, this is as true for pupils making the transition to Year 7 as it is for our Nursery children. Every child has a home reading diary so you can record this reading each day. You don't have to make a comment, sometimes a smiley face or a quick signing of your name will be enough. However, you might like to let the teacher know if your child enjoyed the book, was able to read it well or could answer the questions you asked. You can even use this section to list down new / unfamiliar words your child finds as they read, then with your child you can look them up and build their vocabulary.





In September, teachers really notice which pupils have kept up their reading habits as they have a much smoother transition into their new year groups work. The great news for parents is that it doesn't need to cost any money as you can join the local library and borrow lots of books for free! As Mrs Lama talked about in assembly, there is a Summer Reading challenge for primary aged children which starts on Saturday 13th July. Just by reading one book a week, children can earn stickers and at the end of the challenge, a certificate that can be presented in our BEST Assembly in September. Get Reading!
