Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Parents,

From conversations with pupils and parents over the last week it is clear that many are concerned about the Coronavirus. At school the safety and welfare of the pupils in our care is our top priority at school so we have been following advice from Public Heath England and the department for Education.

At Holbrook School we have always had hand sanitisers which are regularly used (especially on the way into lunch) and boxes of tissues in classrooms for pupils to use to stop the spread of any illnesses and sickness bugs that children routinely get. Since the outbreak staff have been repeating the message to all pupils of the importance of regular hand washing.

If you have been keeping up to date with the news you will have seen that the

country has entered the delay phase to stem the spread of Coronavirus. Only schools directly affected by COVID-19 are closed, the vast majority, like Holbrook Primary School, remain open and will continue to stay open until advised by Public Health England and the government.

Hopefully schools will remain open and the epidemic will guickly pass but in the event of an enforced school closure myself and my team have been thinking about how we can continue to provide learning at home.



Every year group has a fantastic blog already that shows off the excellent learning our pupils do and gives information to support further learning at home. In the event of an extended school closure, teachers will post on the blogs daily a range of links to websites that pupils can access at home and activities that pupils can do offline, we have even got ready exercise books and stationary. During the school year all pupils from year 1 to 6 are used to accessing the blogs from the <u>school website</u> so will know how to see the posts from teachers. Hopefully this advance planning won't be necessary.


Report
