National Tests.

Next week, pupils across the land will be taking part in the Year 6 SATs just as they are here, in Holbrook Primary School. These tests can be an anxious time for pupils and the teachers!

The staff in Year 6 have separated tables, covered displays and briefed all staff who are involved so that we follow the national guidance. All the pupils, to be prepared have practised test conditions so that the experience isn't totally new to them but, the actual tests can still make children a little nervous as they want to do their best for themselves. As a staff, we still support pupils but it is under test conditions, we have to trust in our teaching and all the hard work and learning that Holbrook Primary School has given the pupils in our care for the last seven years.

The SATs tests are just a snap shot of one small part of a child on one day in May, these tests don't show how much your child has grown and developed over their primary education or where their

Many of the pupils tested next week will have been in our care at school since Nursery and have had lots of different teachers, made lots of friends from a huge range of family backgrounds. The children have taken part in range of different trips, had hundreds of varied learning experiences and the chance to take part in a myriad of afterschool clubs. All of this has developed and shaped pupils, not just as learners but as a whole person. This makes me as the Head Teacher, very proud to have been a part of all of the children's learning journey so far.

The bonds of friendship, respect and mutual support that have developed can never be measured by any test and these relationships have been shown this week and I know will be shown next week as well, starting with the Free Year 6 breakfast club. What could be a nervous time for the children, becomes less of a worry and more enjoyable as they enjoy cereal and toast with the many friends they have made over the years. The staff are with them to offer some last minute support and fun. So, if your Year 6 child hasn't taken up this yet, please come in next week.

So to all the Year 6 pupils reading the newsletter this week, I have one last word of advice, have a good weekend, rest up and come in on Monday and remember the **B** in our Holbrook **BEST**—Believe in yourself.
