They get left at school, dropped as litter on the playground or carried back and forward to school in book bags, never read and when parents read them they don't always get recycled so we have asked if the newsletters can stop being printed.

Remember our school target is 96% let's see if more than 11 classes can beat our target next week. Or can a class go green and get 100%?


